These types of projects are very important to the needs of the people from the medical standpoint as well to contribute and create a better environment in which to grow and produce. There I worked primarily in the area of primary prevention programs like: prevention of cavities, hygiene education, eating habits,

immunization program, also with patients in education for prevention of sexual transmitted diseases, birth control, as well in secondary prevention like: Pap smear for detection of cervical cancer, screening to detect diseases with high prevalence in the area like tuberculosis and diagnosis and treatment of community acquired diseases.

CINTERANDES Foundation: General Physician

The purpose of the CINTERANDES Foundation was focused on programs aimed at people in the Amazon jungle in Ecuador as well as in the rural areas of my country. We provided medical attention to indigenous people, reaching those places was not always easy. Once there it was difficult to realize that the medical resources were limited and scarce, but the needs were high. We worked especially in the surgical field with the support of local government authorities, surgeries were done in the local hospitals. The patients were selected two days in advance. The most common surgeries that we did were cholecystectomy, hysterectomy, circumcision, cleft lip and palate and cicatrized burns.
